RESIDENCY: Residency classification will be made according to the following definitions; see the COCC Catalog for complete details. Note that in-state and out-of-state students will convert to in-district two years after the term they begin classes:

In-district: An individual who (or, if 23 or younger, whose parent/legal guardian) owns property or has maintained a permanent and continuous residence in the COCC district for one full year prior to the beginning of the first term of enrollment will be classified as an in-district resident. The COCC District consists of Deschutes, Crook and Jefferson Counties, the northern portion of Klamath and Lake Counties, and the Warm Springs Indian Reservation.

In-state / Out-of-District: An individual who (or, if 23 or younger, whose parent/legal guardian) has maintained a permanent and continuous residence in the state of Oregon, but outside the COCC College district, for one full year prior to the beginning of the first term of enrollment will be classified as an in-state / out-of-district resident.

<u>*Out-of-State:*</u> An individual who (or, if 23 or younger, whose parent/legal guardian) has maintained a permanent and continuous residence outside the state of Oregon for any period in the year prior to the beginning of the first term of enrollment will be classified as an out-of-state resident. Exemption: Per Oregon Administrative Rules, residents of Washington, California, Nevada and Idaho will be charged in-state / out-of-district tuition.

<u>Native American Students</u>: Students who are enrolled members of federally recognized tribes of Oregon or who are enrolled members of a Native American tribe which had traditional and customary tribal boundaries that include parts of the state of Oregon or which had ceded or reserved lands within the state of Oregon shall be charged in-state tuition regardless of their state of residence (note that residents of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs are charged in-district tuition). For a listing of eligible tribes, visit COCC's website. Note that students must provide a copy of tribal enrollment documents to the Director of Admissions/Registrar prior to starting classes.

Military Personnel: Certain out-of-district and out-of-state veteran students will be classified as "non-resident Veteran" students for residency/tuition classification purposes.

CERTIFICATE & DEGREE DESCRIPTIONS

AAOT

Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer Most students who intend to transfer will find that the Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer degree suits their needs as it is intended to meet the lower-division general education requirements for all Oregon public universities and some private colleges. The AAOT allows students to transfer with junior standing for registration purposes.

AS

Associate of Science

The Associate of Science degree is designed as a transfer degree for students who want to transfer to a specific four-year college or university in a specific major. The student and advisor work closely together to tailor the courses to meet the transfer institution's lower division general education and major requirements.

Please Note - Not all certificates and degrees are eligible for financial aid.

AAS

Associate of Applied Science

The Associate of Applied Science degree trains students in specific technical areas to prepare for immediate employment upon graduation. The AAS degree provides students with the hands-on technical skills needed for employment or certification/licensure in a variety of career areas. Students should note that the AAS degree is generally a two-year degree option for full-time students.

CPCC & CC

Career Pathway Certificates and Certificates of Completion

Career Pathways and Certificates of Completion provide hands-on training in a variety of technical areas, with the goal of giving students the skills needed for various technical jobs. Many certificates of completion allow students to stop at a variety of points, gain employment in the field and return at a later date for more advanced training.
